



## **OIE Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe**

# **Action Plan for 2021- 2023**

**(Adopted by the OIE Regional Commission for Europe on 24 May 2021)**

### **I. Introduction**

---

The foundations and principles for developing and implementing the third Action Plan are laid down by the Concept Note of the OIE Regional Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe (the OIE Platform) adopted by the OIE Regional Commission for Europe during the 81st OIE General Session in May 2013.

In addition, following the opinions expressed by the Regional Core Group and the OIE Platform Steering Group, the Terms of reference (ToR) of the OIE Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe have been developed and adopted during the 29th Conference of the OIE Regional Commission for Europe held on 9-10 November 2020. The ToR further define the OIE Platform's governance and the development and implementation of the third Action Plan (2021-2023).

The third Action Plan has been developed by taking into account the needs identified by the OIE Member countries of the Regional Commission for Europe, the outcomes of and lessons learnt from the implementation of two previous Action Plans (2014-2016, 2017-2019), and the results of the external evaluation of the OIE Platform activities.

### **II. Achievements of 2nd Action Plan (2017-2019)**

---

The evaluation of the OIE Platform conducted between January – April 2019 concluded that the OIE Platform remains an important tool in promoting animal welfare in the European region, and that the contribution of the Platform's activities towards compliance with OIE standards and awareness of animal welfare has been acknowledged by donors, partners and beneficiary countries. The evaluation also concluded that despite efforts to regionalise activities, the OIE Platform has more of a blanket-approach and the extent to which individual beneficiary countries advance will largely depend on the resources (both financial and human) put at their disposal by national governments. In principle, the funding that was made available was adequate and sufficient to implement the planned activities. As the OIE Platform does not have a monitoring and evaluation system, and the current indicators in the Action Plans refer to activities and outputs, the OIE Platform should develop its capacity to evaluate achievements and visibility of impact, which will, among others, support the Platform's funding mechanism. In addition, the evaluation put forward the following recommendations for the Platform: to keep up momentum and seek ways to reinforce its stakeholder engagement including with Member Countries, to reduce its breadth of activities while increasing its target audience and to boost the frequency of communication and information sharing on Platform activities, progress and more importantly on follow-up, especially in between Steering Group meetings. In addition, the website of the Platform should be updated regularly so that it can serve its purpose of "knowledge portal" and "best practice" sharing tool even after completion of Action Plans.

### III. Objectives of the 3rd Action Plan for 2021 – 2023

---

#### Impact (Long-term objective):

The desired impact of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Action Plan is to improve animal welfare in Europe through the identified priority topics: slaughter, transport, stray dog population control, welfare of animals in disasters and working equids.

#### Outcome Objectives (short/mid-term objective)

The short/mid-term objective is to progressively improve the compliance of OIE Member Countries from the region of Europe with OIE Animal Welfare standards and OIE guidance on emergency preparedness.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Action Plan, covering the period 2021-2023, ensures the continuity with the two previous Action Plans by building upon their achievements. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Action Plan focuses on strengthening the OIE Member Countries involvement in the development of standards and the regional collaboration towards its implementation, including through the work of National Focal Points on Animal Welfare.

The OIE Platform continues to collaborate with all countries and stakeholders involved in animal welfare in Europe who share a common vision and agreed in the implementation of activities under the Action Plan. In this regard, efforts are made to prevent duplication of existing activities/programmes on animal welfare in the region and to better organize synergies and resources pooling (EU and NGOs projects, etc).

A comprehensive Result Framework and the Theory of Change can be consulted in Annex I and Annex II.

### IV. Scope of the third Action Plan for 2021- 2023

---

The scope of the Action Plan is as follow:

Continuity on the five priority topics of the second Action Plan:

1. Transport of animals by land (OIE TAHC Chapter 7.3), with an extension to also cover transport of animals by sea (OIE TAHC Chapter 7.2)
2. Slaughter of animals (OIE TAHC Chapter 7.5)
3. Stray dog population control (OIE TAHC Chapter 7.7)
4. Welfare of animals in disasters (OIE Guidelines on disaster management and risk reduction in relation to animal health and welfare and veterinary public health)
5. Welfare for Working Equids (OIE TAHC Chapter 7.12)
